Trustee Morlan thinks it should be taken in to consideration that we are short staffed and we will be the first to answer the call. #### Agenda Item #3 Public Hearings Agenda Item #3 A: Amending Land Use Code Article 9 Flood Damage Prevention (FEMA Update) Ordinance 498

Nicol Killian (Community Development Director) states this is a Land Use Text Amendment for our flood damage prevention section of the Code which is Article 9. FEMA has been looking at FIS and FIR which is their flood insurance study. Feels most floodplain lines have for the most part receded. Flood Way has not changed much. The Town of Bayfield has adopted the FEMA maps. On April 25, 2024 it is required to be adopted by the County and jurisdictions in the County to be able to participate in the National Flood Insurance. Because we continue to adopt the FEMA updates. Section 97 need to change the date as well as a definition for base flood. La Plata County has GIS and really good maps for flood plains. Trustee Au asks if you have a surveyor on board why did you not send the flood insurance rate map? Ms. Killian says she did but it is a link. Teddy Jack asks if we are talking about the floodplain? I am probably the only one in the room that lives by the river. They mumble their way through their speeches. Wants people to speak up and wants paper copies. Ms. Killian states to call her and she will go through it with him.
